Mother's Day / Father's Day Card Project

Every year Circle #5 sponsors a Mother's Day/Father's Day alternative giving card project to benefit organizations that strengthen the family. This year our circle has chosen to sponsor Men in the Mirror, Int.

Men in the Mirror (MIM) is a is a biblically based 13-week curriculum for men that asks them to examine their beliefs about what it means to be a man and to learn to express their masculinity in a Christ-like manner. It challenges men to improve their relationship skills by following the example of Jesus in his interactions with men, women, and children.

MIM was written by the Rev. Dr. Kevin Frederick, a retired minister of our presbytery, to counteract domestic violence. The curriculum is being taught in Guatemala with plans to sue it in all 800 congregations in the Nkhoma Synod in Malawi. Kevin Frederick will be with us on June 2nd to share a Moment for Mission during worship and will lead a presentation during Sunday School. Please plan to come to learn more about this important ministry.
