Dear Saints of First Presbyterian,

Well, here we are, in the middle of Lent. It seems early this year; Easter comes too early. Why? Can't we just decide that Easter will be the Sunday after April 15, or something like that? Actually, the Church has known the date of Easter since the Council of Nicaea, the first one, in the year 325! The formula is complicated, and related to the Jewish Lunar Calendar, so of course there are about three ways to interpret it. Nothing in church history is ever simple.

What that means for us, in Newton, in 2024, is that Easter will be here at the tail end of March, in a few weeks. It means that before the flowers are fully blooming, we will be celebrating the Resurrection of the Lord. It means that we will have our Easter morning sunrise service when it is still pretty cold at 7 AM. I hope you — some of you — will join us on the Deal Lot next door for that! After the service, we will go to the Fellowship Hall for breakfast (and hot coffee!) before going to the sanctuary for the main service of the day. After that service, the children will have an Easter Egg Hunt on the Deal Lot.

With Easter we will see another big transition in our lives: Cathy Murdock will retire from serving as our Director of Music. Her time with us will be celebrated on Palm Sunday at a luncheon. And then in early April we will meet our new director, Brandon Winbush. So much change!

Our faith centers on the Resurrection of Jesus. Everything he taught pales in comparison to that and yet gets its meaning from that. All that he said and did comes into focus as important when we realize that this man — the God-Man — rose from the dead. He shows us that love conquers death, and so nothing can separate us from God's love in him. Nothing! No amount of change can affect or overturn his love for us. Cling to that, for it is true!

We celebrate Easter the same way every year and in much the same way as our neighbors in other congregations. We have special music and flowers, and these other events. Another way we could celebrate is to get out among the people of the town, and let them know the good news: the God who created all of us loves us enough to die for us, and will never stop loving us no matter what we do. That's the good news, and many of our neighbors need to hear it! I challenge you to find ways to share it all around the town.



DEDICATION OF DORCAS WOOTEN BENCH

The Church parlor was the scene on Monday, February 12th for the unveiling of a beautiful hand-stitched bench cover presented to the women of the church by Terry Henderson. Son-in-law of well-loved church member, Dorcas Wooten, Henderson described how Dorcas had worked tirelessly on the cover but was unable to finish it before her death in 2022. Terry's late wife, and Dorcas' daughter Rebecca, also helped from time-to-time. Dorcas had wanted the beautiful artwork to be a gift of love for First Presbyterian's women.

Henderson said he sought help in several areas to get the beautiful and intricate cross-stitch- artwork- cover fin-

ished after the deaths of both his mother-in-law and wife; he finally was informed of a firm overseas that could complete the work.

The bench is presently placed in the parlor where it will likely remain and is truly lovely to look at. Angels in rich gold thread are the main theme and the quote, "Angels of Mercy" also adorns the beautiful cover.

The event was hosted by the church's Creative Hands Committee who served delicious light refreshments, and guests enjoyed mingling while viewing the new bench. Terry Henderson came from his home in Raleigh for the occasion and also spoke from his book, *Hayes Barton* @ 100. The attractive and recently released book tells stories of the people, places and events in one of Raleigh's older, historic neighborhoods.

Basketball and a food drive...a winning combination!

It's time for the 6th Annual March Madness Food Drive Challenge!! Ashure Ministry (formerly called ECCCM) provides food for those across the county who need food supplies for their families. FPC is proud to participate in this challenge.

Here's how it works: from March 1st through April 10th, there will be collection boxes in the narthex. We ask you to donate food or money on behalf of your favorite college basketball team. We will have four boxes: Duke, UNC, Wake Forest, and "Other Teams". Food donations count as 1 pound= 2 points. Financial donations are even more helpful, so money counts as \$1 = 3 points. The team with the most points at the end of the period wins the challenge! If you donate on behalf of a team in the "Other" category, you may write your team's name on the product or the bag, and your team will get credit when Ashure tabulates the results. For monetary donations, please write "FPC" and your team's name on the memo line and turn it in to the church office. Donations can also be made at ecccm.org/mmc.

RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE



First Presbyterian will be hosting our Spring Blood Drive on Tuesday, March 26^h from 2:30 until 7:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Along with three other churches in the community, our church sponsors quarterly blood drives and over the years, have provided many, many units of badly needed blood to The Red Cross.

The need is great. Here are some sobering facts: Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood; More than 38,000 blood donations are needed each day; One out of every ten people admitted in a hospital needs blood, and the total number of blood transfusions in a given year is 14 million! Donating blood is a safe and easy process. To be eligible, you must be 17 years old and weigh more than 110 pounds. A healthy donor can donate red blood cells every 56 days. Blood donation is a simple four-step process: registration and medical history, mini-physical (blood pressure and temperature check and check of red blood cell count), donation and refreshments. The actual blood donation typically takes less than 10-12 minutes and the entire process, from the time you arrive to the time you leave, takes about an hour. One pint of donated blood can save the lives of three people!

So, how can you help? Volunteers are needed to assist with the drive: set-up of the Fellowship Hall prior to the drive; assistance with registration and welcoming of donors; providing refreshments after donation and clean up. You need not commit for the entire drive, so if you can work for an hour or two, that would certainly help! Donations of baked goods are also needed. We are often told that our church has the best desserts of all the locations, so please bake up your favorite! Let Patty Neill or Kim Berry know if you can help in any way. And finally, the most important way that you can help, is to give the "gift of life" by donating a unit of your blood to the Red Cross!



Stop Hunger Now!

BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND!!! *Rise Against Hunger's* packaging program is a volunteer-based initiative that coordinates the assembly-line packaging of highly nutritious dehydrated meals comprised of rice, soy, vegetables, and 23 essential vitamins and minerals. During the four past events, volunteers have packaged

over 65,000 meals. Our church will again sponsor an event on Saturday, April 20th at 12:30 p.m.-3:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Again this year, we are excited to be working with our friends from Beth Eden Lutheran Church. We will also be assisted by a group of young adults from the Junior Beta Club at Riverbend Middle School. This event is for all ages and we encourage everyone to participate as they are able.
